Improving Student Engagement & The Issues/Trends

- Assisting faculty balance tool usage based on purpose
- Increasing tool knowledge and resources for students and faculty
- Increasing student choice in assignments and tools
- Build a sense of class community in online courses (e.g. off-topics)
- "Social Media Look" for students to speak freely and share resources

- Utilize instructor Accolades
- Provide point earning for student posts, reactions and comments
- Create Topics based on student contributions and themes seen in the course and in the Yellowdig Community
- Provide effective and relevant discussion prompts or topics

Supporting Cognitive and Social Presence

- Ask students to share work and critique peer's work
- Use reaction emojis, hashtags, comments
- Use tools like video recording, poll, drawing, formula

Regular & Substantive Interaction

- RSI criteria includes
 - Scheduled/frequent interactions throughout the semester
 - Interactions that connect to course outcomes
 - Instructor initiated activities and/or feedback
- RSI in Yellowdig
 - Course Community Topics Questions, Virtual Office, Announcements
 - Accolades, example posts and comments or reactions to posts
 - Assignment/Prompt pages in LMS

Yellowdig's Integration into Our LMS

- Enable grade passback to LMS and display grades in Yellowdig
- Utilize one assignment to connect to the Yellowdig Community
- Create/utilize student and faculty Yellowdig resources for anticipated issues and frequently asked questions
- Add course link to Yellowdig community in each module
- Provide discussions prompts or topics on LMS

Experiences/top Tips in Yellowdig for Student Engagement

- Provide effective discussion prompts
 - a list of subtopics
 - a list of thought-provoking questions
 - Asking students to share resources, their individual or group work, comment to others' work
- Encourage student to create topics they are interested—Friendship?
- Encourage students to frequently engage in Yellowdig discussions every week—sense of community?



Experiences/top Tips in Yellowdig for Student Engagement

- Add reactions and comment to each other —positive experience with interactions with classmates?
- Add hashtags that might attract students sharing the same interest —positive experience with interactions with classmates?
- Add interesting accolades to students' posts (no point attached)



ID Issues and Trends in Student Engagement

- Balancing tool usage based on purpose
- Student/faculty lack of tool knowledge and familiarity
- Student choice in assignments and participation
- Alignment to student learning outcomes
